Collection: Research using the Internet

Introduction

- The raw material which feeds the analytical and intelligence production process is information. The highest quality intelligence is produced from high quality authenticated information from the most reliable and accurate sources.
- This course teaches researchers and analysts how to exploit the latest search methods and techniques so that relevant information is collected quickly and accurately from authenticated sources. Participants will be shown how to be aware of any impartiality or bias which may be present, not only in the information they collect, but also by the sources used.
- Often tracking down the right information can be due as much to detective work as to good searching skills. Researchers and analysts who attend this course will be given the opportunity to develop their investigative skills under the supervision of skilled and experienced case officers.

Course content

- Introduction to the Internet.
- Analysis of a search request.
- Search engines and Boolean logic.
- Identification and selection of suitable sources.
- Assessment of source reliability.
- Manipulation of data and media types.



Target audience

- This course is aimed at researchers and analysts. The course will also benefit anyone who uses the internet to find information and needs to do so more quickly, effectively and efficiently.

Conduct of training

- The training will typically take place in the analyst or researcher's normal working environment, using the tools routinely available to the analyst. Training can also take place in a training room equipped by information2intelligence Ltd.
