Processing: Information Analysis

Introduction

- In today's high speed information-centric world, policy and decision makers have immediate access to raw information which used to be only available to analysts. This means that intelligence customers now want more. They need to know what events and information mean and their potential effects. They also need to be informed quickly so that they can take important decisions before they are overtaken by events.
- This course covers the skills needed by modern intelligence analysts to respond to changing events in a robust and dynamic environment. As well as teaching participants how to think in a critical and structured way, the course also develops flexibility and imagination, whilst maintaining awareness of bias and deception.

Course content

- A framework for analysis.
- Understanding and answering questions.
- Critical reading.
- Developing objectivity, accuracy, consistency.
- Being aware of and challenging, assumptions, perceptions, bias and deception.
- Making judgments and coming to conclusions.



Target audience

- This course is aimed at all personnel within an organisation who are involved in analysis of information in support of policy and decision makers.
- This course will also benefit intelligence consumers to enable them to better understand and develop confidence in the analysis process.

Conduct of training

- The training is conducted over an intensive three days and will involve lectures and practical sessions.
